

This Party Made It Hard On Deer

This group of hunters got its share of deer on the first day of Kent's 1953 open season hunting on the farm of Wilmer Atkinson, near St. Jame's Church. They bagged three by early afternoon and made another drive before nightfall.

The deer shown, left to right, weighed 203, 155, and 138 and had nine, six and five points respectively.

The Atkinsons, father and son, accounted for two of the deer while Caulk was the successful hunter in the third kill.

The deer bagged by the elder Atkinson (Wilmer) was the first reported and was killed about 7:30 A. M. on the first day.
